ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN

Argosy University, Twin Cities
AND
Metropolitan State University

*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between **Argosy University, Twin Cities** (hereinafter sending institution), and **Metropolitan State University, 700 West Seventh Street, St. Paul, MN 55106** (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established a **Dental Hygiene AS** (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **Dental Hygiene BSDH** (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept **90** credits from the sending program. A total of **44-45** credits remain to complete the receiving program.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in the uSelect Audit.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on **12/01/2014** and shall remain in effect until the end date of **12/01/2019** or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning **07/01/2019** (within six months of the end date).
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

Instructions

- List all required courses in both academic programs.
- MnTC goal areas transfer to the receiving institution according to the goal areas designated by the sending institution.
- Do not indicate a goal area for general education courses that are not part of the MnTC.
- For restricted or unrestricted electives, list number of credits.
- Credits applied: the receiving institution course credit amount may be more or less than the sending institution credit amount. Enter the number of credits that the receiving institution will apply toward degree completion.
- Show equivalent university-college courses on the same row to ensure accurate DARS encoding.
- Equiv/Sub/Wav column: If a course is to be encoded as equivalent, enter Equiv. If a course is to be accepted by the university as a "substitution" only for the purposes of this agreement, enter Sub. If a course requirement is waived by the receiving institution, enter Wav. If a course is to be accepted by the university as a MnTC goal area, restricted elective or unrestricted elective, leave the cell blank.





- The number of required General Education/MnTC credits in your program at the community/technical college (listed in Section A)
- A college's distribution requirements within the MnTC—all MnSCU institutions require 40 credits in 10 Goal Areas, but colleges have different requirements as to how the credits are distributed within the goal areas—e.g., Metro State requires two writing courses for Goal 1 (6 credits), the sending institution may require two writing courses plus a communications course (9 credits) in Goal 1.
- When MnTC electives are listed (i.e., no specific course is named), the number of goal areas a course meets will determine the number of courses you may need to take to fulfill MnTC requirements—i.e., it's better to choose courses meeting more than one goal area.
- May need to include upper-division credits in order to fulfill the 40 credit upper-division requirement for graduation (see footnote).

Consult an academic advisor (at either the sending or receiving institution) to plan the completion of the MnTC requirement.

²DENH 440—Restorative Functions Clinic is a 1 credit course that, in combination with DENH 420 leads to Restorative Functions certification by the MN State Board of Dentistry. This option requires contractual agreement with a dentist for completion of the restorative requirements.
